BUILDING CONSTRUCTION NOT REQUIRING A GRADING PERMIT

A grading permit is not required for a single-story building less than 500 square feet in size, if:

- 1. The site was previously graded in conformance with City codes and standards and a soils report was required.
- 2. The proposed earthwork is less than the thresholds established in the City of Irvine Grading Regulations.
- 3. The building construction is not supported by new compacted fill. The placement of any compacted fill intended to support a structure will require a grading permit regardless of structure size or quantity of earthwork.
- 4. In the opinion of the Chief Building Official, there are no existing special conditions that warrant a grading permit (proximity to slopes or adjacent property, drainage conditions, unfavorable soil conditions, liquefaction potential, etc.).

Where a grading permit is not required, the following shall be included in the building permit submittal:

- A soil report from a licensed professional engineer qualified in geotechnical engineering, which shall report a minimum, the suitability of the bearing soils, bearing capacities, geotechnical constraints, and impact to surrounding properties. Refer to Bulletin # 220 for soil report requirements for additions.
- 2. Building plans shall show the requirement for use of sulfate resistant concrete only for concrete in contact with soil.
- 3. Building and/or site plans shall demonstrate compliance with the City of Irvine Grading Manual with regard to surface drainage pattern and disposal.
