- F. Irvine Korean Evergreen Association (IKEA)

Councilmember Lee introduced IKEA's new President-elect Juneu Kim, who will be sworn in at the February 2, 2016 IKEA meeting. Mr. Kim shared his background and goals for IKEA.

2. Orange County Senior Citizens Advisory Council-Affiliated Committees

A. Orange County Senior Citizens Advisory Council

Councilmember Ranjbar reported the focus of the January 8 meeting was the review of bylaws, rules and regulations of the Committee.

B. Health and Nutrition

Vice Chair Jacobs reported the focus of the January 20 meeting was interactive brain games to show importance of cognitive function. There was also discussion about funding cuts for the Age Well and SeniorServ programs that serve other cities in the County.

C. Housing and Transportation

Councilmember Lee reported a presentation was made by the Orange County Aging Services Collaborative.

D. Legislative

Councilmember Ranjbar reported she is now an official member of the Legislative Committee. At this time, Senior Travelers representative Natalie Chaikin arrived to report that the 2016 excursions and trips calendar is being finalized. A day-trip to the Ronald Reagan Library has been confirmed for June 6, 2016. Many fliers for other events are available at the front counters of each senior center.

3. Senior Citizens Council Committees

A. Facilities Committee

Vice Chair Jacobs reported there was no meeting. Supervisor Kaleikini reported staff has been very focused on the opening of the Trabuco Center. Other projects in the works are:

- Refrigerator/freezer condensers in the Lakeview Senior Center kitchen will be replaced.
- Curbs in front of IADHS will be modified and two new handicap parking stalls will be added to that lot.
- Various sidewalk slabs around the Lakeview Senior Center have been ground down.
- A contractor has been secured to work on the donor wall at Lakeview Senior Center.
- The potted plants around Lakeview Senior Center will receive additional attention as the plants acclimate to their new locations.

B. Nutrition Committee

Councilmember Lee reported the Lakeview Senior Center Rose Garden Café averages 120 meals daily, and more volunteers are needed. The Irvine Meals on Wheels program now has a waitlist and is also in need of additional volunteer drivers.

C. Leadership Committee

Councilmember Jones reported the Billiards and Computer Lab programs are doing well. Staff from the Rancho Senior Center fitness center will be moving to Trabuco Center and a recruitment is open to fill the vacancy at Rancho. Friends of Outreach received a donation for End of Life special needs assistance. IADHS had nine new participants. IECSA will have a Chinese New Year celebration on February 17. The Senior Travelers will host a Travel Show on February 12. The Keen Center offers positive aging group meetings each Friday, and pharmacy students are available for assistance.
