 Distinguished Service Award: Katy Lai, International Crafters/Friends of Outreach

2. Crime Prevention Against Seniors

Detective Gavin Hudson and Civilian Fraud Investigator Terrie Covarrubias from the Irvine Police Department provided a presentation with handouts.

Points discussed:

- Identity Theft and how to protect yourself.
- Current and active calling scams, to never give out personal information and verify caller is who they are or from the agency they are representing.

- Protect your property and never allow some to rush you into a decision about signing over property or modifying loan documents.
- Block telemarketing calls from land lines and cell phones, as much as possible, by registering phone numbers with 888-382-1222.
- Internet phishing are things like emails indicating you have won a prize.
- Block or tag these emails as spam or forward to IC3@fbi.gov.
