1. Supporting Young Children's Development Workshop

Community Services Senior Leader Marcy Backhus announced The Heart of Connecting provided a workshop on October 5 to family child care providers on "Social-Emotional Development of Children." The 15 provider attendees learned practical strategies to benefit children in the development of social and emotional skills.

2. Helping the Behaviorally Challenging Child (October 19 for providers, November 16 for parents)

Community Services Supervisor Traci Stubbler announced a presentation for schoolage child care providers titled "Helping the Behaviorally Challenging Child" will be held on October 19 from 9:30-11:30 a.m. The venue can accommodate 100 attendees, and 50 providers are registered to date. A presentation for parents of school-age children will also be provided on November 16 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Both presentations are based on the book "The Explosive Child" by Dr. Ross Greene and each attendee will receive a copy of the book.

- Recommend the Community Services Commission approve the appointment of Linda Hunter and Amber Star Leal to serve as Government, Civic, or Community Members on the Irvine Child Care Committee from February 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Irvine Child Care Committee, known as ICCC, was established in 1987 and their purpose is to develop recommendations and initiatives related to the availability of quality and affordable child care and education in Irvine.

ICCC is made up of fifteen voting members consisting of liaison and appointee representatives that include:

- City Council appointees
- Community Services Commission
- Educational organizations
- Government, civic, or community
- Center or home-based child care providers
- Parents and/or guardians

ICCC member terms vary from one to two years. ICCC meets six times per year to:

- Network and share information on child care policies and programs, and disseminate information to the community; and
- Plan and implement annual child care provider training conferences and community education forums.

An open recruitment is held every two years to fill the two provider and the two government, civic, or community member positions, each to serve a two-year term beginning the following January. The recruitment was open for a five-week period. A total of 11 applications were received.

A Selection Committee comprised of Committee Members Lin, Blevins, Yang, and Community Services Commissioner Lauren Johnson-Norris conducted candidate interviews on October 23, 2017. The Selection Committee recommends the appointment of Donna Schwartze, Jessica Simoncini, Linda Hunter, and Amber Star Leal to the Committee (Attachment 2).

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

None applicable.

ANALYSIS

The Committee is a public advisory body reporting to the Community Services Commission. Committee members provide resources and recommend initiatives related to the availability of quality and affordable child care and early childhood education in Irvine.

An open recruitment was conducted September 7 through September 29, 2017 to fill two Provider and two Government, Civic, or Community Member positions each serving two-year terms. Marketing and outreach efforts included a City of Irvine press release, a posting on the City website and through a child care coordination email blast to over 500 contacts. Eleven applications were received and ten applicants were interviewed (one applicant was unavailable for a phone or in-person interview).

The Selection Committee recommended candidates that demonstrated awareness of child care related issues and the ability to assess, articulate, and advocate for the concerns and needs of young children and families. The background and experience of the recommended candidates closely aligned with the Committee's goals to enhance child care and early education, provide resources and serve as a liaison to the community as a whole.

The Committee recommends the Community Services Commission approve Donna Schwartze and Jessica Simoncini to serve as Provider Members on the Committee and Linda Hunter and Amber Star Leal to serve as Government, Community or Civic Members on the Committee.

- 39 year Irvine resident and mother of three adult children
- Served as a Provider member on the Committee since 2003
- Director of the Irvine Community Nursery School

- 20 year Irvine resident
- Served as provider member on the Committee since 2015

- Worked in the field of early childhood education and family systems for over 46 years
- Senior Director of Education and Chief Operations Officer at Pretend City Children's Museum
- Previously owned and operated a family child care program for nine years

Amber Star Leal:

- Three year Irvine resident and mother of three young children
- Law Clerk for Fagen, Friedman and Fulfrost and Research Assistant for University of California, Irvine (UCI) Law
- President of the Children's Advocacy Group at UCI Law
- Currently working on completing her Juris Doctor degree from the UCI School of Law

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this public entity shall be the City of Irvine Child Care Committee.

ARTICLE II

Location

The principal office for the transaction of business of this Committee is fixed and located in the City of Irvine, County of Orange, California.

ARTICLE III

Mission and Purpose

The purpose of the Irvine Child Care Committee is to actively serve as a resource and advise the Community Services Commission for City Council on child care related issues. Its role is to develop recommendations and initiatives as they relate to the availability of quality and affordable childcare and education in Irvine. The Irvine Child Care Committee works in a cooperative relationship with the support of the Community Services Commission, the Child Care Coordination Office, the Community Services Department, and the Community Development Department to enhance the provision of child care and education, provide outreach, and to serve as a liaison to the community as a whole.

ARTICLE IV

Membership

Section 1. Members

The Committee shall be composed of fifteen (15) voting members consisting of Liaison and Appointee representatives and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code.

A. Liaison Members:

1. Three (3) members who represent educational organizations:

a.) Irvine Unified School District	(1)
b.) University of California, Irvine	(1)
c.) Irvine Valley College	(1)

2. Two (2) members who represent government, civic or community. (2)

Unless otherwise represented on the Committee, the City of Irvine shall provide staff

Section 2. Appointment of Members

- A. Liaison Members
 - 1. Educational Organization Members:

Educational Organization members shall be appointed by their respective organizations and shall serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.

2. All Remaining Liaison Members (Government, Civic, or Community Members Center based or Home-based Child Care Provider Members; Parents/Guardians Members)

In accordance with City policy, the availability of such positions shall be made public. All remaining liaison members shall be appointed through the following procedure: All interested persons shall submit written applications from the date of posting until the last working day in September. Each application shall be reviewed; screening and interviewing shall be conducted thereafter with recommendations presented to the Committee. The Committee will then forward its nominations to the Community Services Commission for formal appointment. New Committee members shall normally be seated at the meeting in January. Term of office shall be for a period of two (2) years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.

- B. Appointee Members:
 - 1. City Council Members shall each appoint one (1) member to the Child Care Committee to a term in accordance with that term of office.
 - 2. The Community Services Commission shall be represented on the Child Care Committee by a member of the Community Services Commission Task Force-Child, Youth, Family and Senior Services to a term in accordance with that term of office.

C. City of Irvine Non-Voting Representatives:

Such representatives shall be appointed by the Director of Community Services and Community Development or their designees.

Section 3. Removal of Members

It shall be the duty of each member to take an active part in the Committee's deliberation and to act in whatever capacity the member may be called. Absence from two (2) consecutive meetings may constitute the retirement of the member. After the second consecutive absence, the member will be contacted. In the event that a member is deemed retired, the member and the appointed body will be contacted. New members shall be appointed following the designated procedure for their appropriate position.

Section 4. Vacancies

In the event of any committee vacancy within this organization because of death, resignation, removal, or disqualification of any member, the Chairperson shall seek appropriate appointment of a new representative to fill the vacancy for the duration of the appointment.

Section 5. Meetings

The meetings of the Committee shall be held at least six (6) times each year, at which time the members of the Committee shall convene, in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws, to consider the affairs of the organization and transact such other business as may properly be brought before the meeting.

Special meetings of the members of the Committee, for any purpose, shall be called at any time by the Chairperson, or if she/he is unable or absent or refuses to act, by either the Vice-Chairperson, or by any three (3) members of the Committee. Written notice of the time and place of such special meetings shall be posted and sent to each member no less than 24 hours before such a meeting in accordance with the Brown Act (Section 54956).

Section 6. Limitation of Actions by Agenda

No action shall be taken by the Committee, on any items not appearing on the posted agenda.

Section 7. Public Comment

The Chair shall ask if any person wishes to speak to the Child Care Committee on items within the Committee's jurisdiction; however, no action may be taken on matters that are not part of the posted agenda. Items not part of the posted agenda will be heard during the Public Comment Section. Public comments regarding posted agenda items will be heard at the time the matter is heard by the Committee. Public comments are limited to ten minutes per person.

Section 8. Initiating an Agenda Item

<u>8.1 Committee Request</u> - Any Child Care Committee member may initiate an item for Committee consideration by making such request to the Child Care Program Coordinator by no later than the legal deadline for noticing and placing the matter on the agenda.

<u>8.2 Public Request</u> – Any member of the public may initiate a request to have the Child Care Committee consider an item within the Committee's jurisdiction by making such request in writing at least fourteen days preceding the Committee meetings.

<u>8.3 Staff Requests</u> - City staff may initiate a request to have the Child Care Committee consider an item within the Committee's jurisdiction by making a request to the Child Care Program Coordinator at least fourteen days prior to the meeting at which consideration is to take place.

Section 9. Quorum

A majority of the Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. In the event that less than a quorum of members are present at any meeting, the members who are present may adjourn the meeting but may not transact any business, and the notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting be made public and given to absent members of the time and place established.

Section 10. Powers and Duties

The Committee shall have, as permitted by City Council order, all primary powers and authorities necessary and convenient to carry out the business and affairs of this organization. They shall report salient findings directly to the Community Services Commission at least once a year.

Any public communication, written or verbal, representing the position of the Committee shall require prior approval of two officers of the Committee.

ARTICLE V Officers

Section 1. Titles

The officers of this organization shall be Chairperson and Vice-Chairpersons-and Recording Secretary. The officers shall be nominated and elected by consent of the voting members of the Committee.

Section 2. Election

After the installation of the members of the Committee at the January meeting, the Committee shall elect a Chairperson Vice-Chairperson, and Recording Secretary to serve for a period of one year (12 months).

Section 3. Removal and Resignation

Any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, by a majority of all members of the Committee at any regular or special meeting of the Committee. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or the Vice-Chair of the Committee. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time of the receipt of such notice, or at any later time specified therein and, unless otherwise specified in such resignation, the acceptance of the same shall not be necessary to make the resignation effective.

Section 4. Vacancies in the Offices of the Organization

A vacancy in any office of this organization because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these bylaws for regular appointments to such office at either a regular or special meeting of the members of the Committee called for that purpose.

Section 5. Duties of the Chairperson

The Chairperson shall have the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this organization. She/he shall preside at all meetings of members of the Committee. She/he shall have the power to appoint subcommittee chairpersons and committees as necessary, and shall receive from them reports of their business.

Section 6. Duties of the Vice-Chairpersons

A. In the absence or disability of the Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson shall perform all the duties of the Chairperson, and in so acting shall have all the powers of the Chairperson. The Vice-Chairperson shall be in charge of communications and shall have such other powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed, by the Committee and its Chairperson.

Section 7. Duties of the Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary will take minutes of the Committee meetings and submit them to the Irvine Child Care Committee staff within 10 days of the meeting. In the absence of the Recording Secretary, the Chairperson may appoint a committee member to take meeting notes.

ARTICLE VI

Amendment of Bylaws

The bylaws may be amended or repealed and new bylaws adopted by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the Committee. The bylaws shall take effect upon adoption by resolution by the Community Services Commission.

ARTICLE VII Standing Rules

The Committee shall have the authority to enact standing rules as needed.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Review and provide input on proposed amendments to the Irvine Child Care Committee bylaws.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Irvine Child Care Committee (Committee) serves as an advisory body to the Community Services Commission (Commission). The purpose of the Committee is to provide input on child care related issues and to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable and quality child care and early education in Irvine. The primary objectives of the Committee are to work collaboratively with community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education, provide outreach, and serve as a liaison to the community.

The Committee is comprised of 15 voting members consisting of: five City Council appointees; three education appointees; two community child care providers; two parents/guardians; two government, civic or community representatives; and a Community Services Commission Task Force representative. The Committee meets six times a year to discuss strategies to enhance the provision of child care and early education in Irvine, plan parent education events and provide input on professional development opportunities for early childhood educators.

The Community Services Department provides support to the Committee and other advisory bodies by providing staff liaisons and additional staff members who assist with meetings and board activities. The department is facilitating a bylaw review for advisory bodies that report to the Commission. The purpose of the review is to establish a uniform framework among all five advisory bodies to ensure consistency; to reflect current and best practices; to achieve operational efficiencies; and to incorporate annual reporting by each advisory body to the Commission on its goals and initiatives.

The bylaws amendment process includes the following:

- 1. Advisory bodies review and discuss proposed bylaw amendments.
- 2. Advisory Body Chair and staff liaison present proposed bylaw amendments and annual goals/initiatives/purpose to the Commission for review and comment. The advisory bodies' presentations will be staggered throughout the year.
- 3. Legal review of proposed bylaw amendments.
- 4. Advisory bodies adopt bylaws.
- 5. Adopted bylaws of all advisory bodies are presented to the Commission.

The proposed Committee bylaw amendments are recommended for Committee consideration, with approval at a future meeting as identified in Attachments 1 and 2.

ANALYSIS

City staff reviewed the Committee bylaws and is proposing amendments to include consistency with formatting and the following:

SECTION 3.0. PURPOSE, MISSION AND DUTIES

- Added authority for the Committee to appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee.
- Added the Committee shall report to the Community Services Commission on the Committee's goals and accomplishments annually.

SECTION 4. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

• Added this section to include that Irvine Municipal Code Division 4 is applicable to all commissions and committees operating under the authority of the City of Irvine.

SECTION 5. MEMBERSHIP

- Reduced the number of members from fifteen to fourteen to align with current practice.
- Added guidelines to fill vacancies and the provision that a member may be removed after absence from three consecutive meetings.

SECTION 6. VOTING

• Added a voting section to indicate one vote per member and proxy votes are not permitted.

SECTION 7. OFFICERS

• Removed the position of Recording Secretary and procedure for removing a Committee officer.

SECTION 8. MEETINGS

• Remove redundant language already covered by the Ralph M. Brown Act and the ability for a member of the public to initiate an agenda item.

SECTION 9. BYLAWS

• Remove the requirement to update the bylaws by adopted resolution of the Community Services Commission.

Following Committee input, staff will develop a revised draft of the bylaws for legal review and Committee adoption at a future meeting.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The Committee could recommend no changes to its existing bylaws.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Committee's financial impacts are minimal and included in the approved FY 2017-18 Budget. The Community Services Department supports the Committee by providing a staff liaison. Additional staff assists with the implementation of advisory body initiatives and activities, development of meeting minutes, agenda packets and postings.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this public entity shall be the City of Irvine Child Care Committee.

ARTICLE II

Location

The principal office for the transaction of business of this Committee is fixed and located in the City of Irvine, County of Orange, California.

ARTICLE III

Mission and Purpose

The purpose of the Irvine Child Care Committee is to actively serve as a resource and advise the Community Services Commission for City Council on child care related issues. Its role is to develop recommendations and initiatives as they relate to the availability of quality and affordable childcare and education in Irvine. The Irvine Child Care Committee works in a cooperative relationship with the support of the Community Services Commission, the Child Care Coordination Office, the Community Services Department, and the Community Development Department to enhance the provision of child care and education, provide outreach, and to serve as a liaison to the community as a whole.

ARTICLE IV

Membership

Members Section 1.

The Committee shall be composed of fifteen (15) voting members consisting of Liaison and Appointee representatives and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code.

A. Liaison Members:

1. Three (3) members who represent educational organizations:

a.) Irvine Unified School District	(1)

Appointment of Members Section 2.

A. Liaison Members

1. Educational Organization Members:

Educational Organization members shall be appointed by their respective organizations and shall serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.

2. All Remaining Liaison Members (Government, Civic, or Community Members Center based or Home-based Child Care Provider Members; Parents/Guardians Members)

In accordance with City policy, the availability of such positions shall be made public. All remaining liaison members shall be appointed through the following procedure: All interested persons shall submit written applications from the date of posting until the last working day in September. Each application shall be reviewed; screening and interviewing shall be conducted thereafter with recommendations presented to the Committee. The Committee will then forward its nominations to the Community Services Commission for formal appointment. New Committee members shall normally be seated at the meeting in January. Term of office shall be for a period of two (2) years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.

- B. Appointee Members:
 - 1. City Council Members shall each appoint one (1) member to the Child Care Committee to a term in accordance with that term of office.
 - 2. The Community Services Commission shall be represented on the Child Care Committee by a member of the Community Services Commission Task Force-Child, Youth, Family and Senior Services to a term in accordance with that term of office.

Child, Youth, Family and Senior Services to a term in accordance with that term of office.

C. City of Irvine Non-Voting Representatives:

Such representatives shall be appointed by the Director of Community Services and Community Development or their designees.

Section 3. Removal of Members

It shall be the duty of each member to take an active part in the Committee's deliberation and to act in whatever capacity the member may be called. Absence from two (2) consecutive meetings may constitute the retirement of the member. After the second consecutive absence, the member will be contacted. In the event that a member is deemed retired, the member and the appointed body will be contacted. New members shall be appointed following the designated procedure for their appropriate position.

Section 4. Vacancies

In the event of any committee vacancy within this organization because of death, resignation, removal, or disqualification of any member, the Chairperson shall seek appropriate appointment of a new representative to fill the vacancy for the duration of the appointment.

Section 5. Meetings

The meetings of the Committee shall be held at least six (6) times each year, at which time the members of the Committee shall convene, in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws, to consider the affairs of the organization and transact such other business as may properly be brought before the meeting.

Special meetings of the members of the Committee, for any purpose, shall be called at any time by the Chairperson, or if she/he is unable or absent or refuses to act, by either the Vice-Chairperson, or by any three (3) members of the Committee. Written notice of the time and place of such special meetings shall be posted and sent to each member no less than 24 hours before such a meeting in accordance with the Brown Act (Section 54956).

Section 6. Limitation of Actions by Agenda

No action shall be taken by the Committee, on any items not appearing on the posted agenda.

Section 7. Public Comment

The Chair shall ask if any person wishes to speak to the Child Care Committee on items within the Committee's jurisdiction; however, no action may be taken on matters that are not part of the posted agenda. Items not part of the posted agenda will be heard during the Public Comment Section. Public comments regarding posted agenda items will be heard at the time the matter is heard by the Committee. Public comments are limited to ten minutes per person.

Section 8. Initiating an Agenda Item

<u>8.1 Committee Request</u> - Any Child Care Committee member may initiate an item for Committee consideration by making such request to the Child Care Program Coordinator by no later than the legal deadline for noticing and placing the matter on the agenda.

<u>8.2 Public Request</u> – Any member of the public may initiate a request to have the Child Care Committee consider an item within the Committee's jurisdiction by making such request in writing at least fourteen days preceding the Committee meetings.

<u>8.3 Staff Requests</u> - City staff may initiate a request to have the Child Care Committee consider an item within the Committee's jurisdiction by making a request to the Child Care Program Coordinator at least fourteen days prior to the meeting at which consideration is to take place.

Section 9. Quorum

A majority of the Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. In the event that less than a quorum of members are present at any meeting, the members who are present may adjourn the meeting but may not transact any business, and the notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting be made public and given to absent members of the time and place established.

Section 10. Powers and Duties

The Committee shall have, as permitted by City Council order, all primary powers and authorities necessary and convenient to carry out the business and affairs of this organization. They shall report salient findings directly to the Community Services Commission at least once a year.

Any public communication, written or verbal, representing the position of the Committee shall require prior approval of two officers of the Committee.

ARTICLE V Officers

Section 1. Titles

The officers of this organization shall be Chairperson and Vice-Chairpersons and Recording Secretary. The officers shall be nominated and elected by consent of the voting members of the Committee.

Section 2. Election

After the installation of the members of the Committee at the January meeting, the Committee shall elect a Chairperson Vice-Chairperson, and Recording Secretary to serve for a period of one year (12 months).

Section 3. Removal and Resignation

Any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, by a majority of all members of the Committee at any regular or special meeting of the Committee. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or the Vice-Chair of the Committee. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time of the receipt of such notice, or at any later time specified therein and, unless otherwise specified in such resignation, the acceptance of the same shall not be necessary to make the resignation effective.

Section 4. Vacancies in the Offices of the Organization

A vacancy in any office of this organization because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these bylaws for regular appointments to such office at either a regular or special meeting of the members of the Committee called for that purpose.

Section 5. Duties of the Chairperson

The Chairperson shall have the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this organization. She/he shall preside at all meetings of members of the Committee. She/he shall have the power to appoint subcommittee chairpersons and committees as necessary, and shall receive from them reports of their business.

Section 6. Duties of the Vice-Chairpersons

A. In the absence or disability of the Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson shall perform all the duties of the Chairperson, and in so acting shall have all the powers of the Chairperson. The Vice-Chairperson shall be in charge of communications and shall have such other powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed, by the Committee and its Chairperson.

Section 7. Duties of the Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary will take minutes of the Committee meetings and submit them to the Irvine Child Care Committee staff within 10 days of the meeting. In the absence of the Recording Secretary, the Chairperson may appoint a committee member to take meeting notes.

ARTICLE VI

Amendment of Bylaws

The bylaws may be amended or repealed and new bylaws adopted by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the Committee. The bylaws shall take effect upon adoption by resolution by the Community Services Commission.

ARTICLE VII Standing Rules

The Committee shall have the authority to enact standing rules as needed.

1.0 <u>NAME</u>

The name of this advisory body of the City of Irvine shall be the Irvine Child Care Committee (hereinafter "Committee").

2.0 LOCATION

The principal office for the transaction of business is hereby fixed and located at 1 Civic Center Plaza in Irvine, California.

3.0 PURPOSE, MISSION, AND DUTIES

- 3.1 <u>Purpose</u> The Committee's purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine, reporting to the City's Community Services Commission. The Committee shall provide input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.
- 3.2 <u>Mission</u> The Committee's mission is to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.
- 3.3 <u>Duties</u> The Committee's duties include, but shall not be limited to, working collaboratively with City departments and community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education, providing outreach, and serving as a liaison to the community.

The Committee shall appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and one representative to serve on the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee, as appropriate.

The Committee shall report annually to the Community Services Commission on its goals and accomplishments.

4.0 GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Provisions of the Irvine Municipal Code Division 4-Commissions and Committees, are applicable to all commissions and committees appointed by or otherwise operating under authority of the City of Irvine, City Council or its delegate.

5.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Committee shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) voting members consisting of appointee and liaison representatives, and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code. The Membership on the Committee is comprised of representatives meeting the following requirements:

- 5.1 Appointee Members
 - 5.1.1 One representative from each of the following educational Organizations, Irvine Unified School District, University of California, Irvine, and Irvine Valley College, shall be appointed by their respective organizations and serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.
 - 5.1.2 Each City Council Member shall appoint one member for a total of five (5) members to serve a term in accordance with that Council Member's term of office.
- 5.2 <u>Liaison Members</u> Shall be selected through the following procedure: All interested persons shall submit written applications and qualified applicants will be invited to an oral interview with a minimum of three (3) Committee members and one (1) optional representative from the Community Services Commission. Term of office shall be a period of two years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.
 - 5.2.1 Government, Civic or Community Members Two (2)
 - 5.2.2 Center- or Home-based Child Care Provider Members Two (2)
 - 5.2.3 Parent/Guardian Members Two (2)
- 5.3 Resignation, Vacancies, and Removal
 - 5.3.1 <u>Resignation</u> Any member may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or Vice Chair.
 - 5.3.2 <u>Vacancies</u> In the event a vacancy is created, it shall be filled by the same method by which the vacancy was previously filled, at a timeline established by the Committee.
 - 5.3.3. <u>Removal</u> Absence from three (3) consecutive meetings may constitute the removal of the member.

6.0 <u>VOTING</u>

- 6.1 <u>One Vote Per Member</u> Committee members shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6.2 <u>Proxy Votes</u> No proxy votes are permitted.

7.0 OFFICERS

Officers of the Committee shall be Chair and Vice Chair, each of whom shall be a member of the Committee. The officers shall be elected by the membership of the Committee annually.

- 7.1 <u>Election</u> Regular election of officers shall be held annually. The term of office shall be one (1) year, commencing upon election.
- 7.2 <u>Chair</u> The Chair shall have the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this Committee. The Chair shall preside over all meetings and is responsible for approval of the agenda. The Chair shall represent the Committee to the Community Services Commission, the City Council and City staff.
- 7.3 <u>Vice Chair</u> In the absence or resignation of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all of the duties of the Chair, and in so acting shall have all of the authority of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Committee.

8.0 <u>MEETINGS</u>

All meetings shall be opened to the public and shall conform to the provisions of the "Ralph M. Brown Act".

- 8.1 <u>Agenda</u> Agenda items may be submitted 30 days in advance by any Committee member upon notification to the Chair or City liaison to be included on the agenda. The agenda shall be established with items as coordinated by the Chair and City liaison.
- 8.2 <u>Procedures</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the general conduct of meetings.
- 8.3 <u>Quorum</u> A majority of the Committee members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of Committee members at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry a motion, proposal and/or resolution.
- 8.4 <u>Regular Meetings</u> The Committee shall meet six (6) times each year per an annual schedule approved by the Committee by the last meeting of the previous year. All regular meeting notices shall be posted in a

location accessible to the public at least 72 hours before the time of the meeting and must describe the business to be transacted.

8.5 <u>Special Meetings</u> - A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chair or by a majority of the members of the Committee, by delivering personally or by mail written notice to each member and notice as required by law for general circulation, and by posting notice in a location freely accessible to the public 24 hours before the time of the meeting. The special meeting notice must specify both the time and the place of the meeting and the business to be transacted.

9.0 BYLAWS

The Committee bylaws are established to regulate itself, as allowed or provided for by the City of Irvine.

9.1 Amendment of Bylaws - These Bylaws may be amended by a threefourth (3/4) vote of the voting membership.
