#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Recommend the Community Services Commission approve the appointment of Joshua Arnaldo and Jenny Woo to serve as Parent Representatives on the Irvine Child Care Committee from January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2020.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Irvine Child Care Committee, (Committee), was established in 1987 and their purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine by providing input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.

In accordance with Committee Bylaws (Attachment 1), the volunteer Committee is comprised of 14 voting members consisting of Liaison and Appointee representatives. The six Liaison members represent; two community representatives; two center- or home-based child care providers; and two parent/guardian members. The eight Appointee members represent three educational organizations and five City Council appointees.

In accordance with Committee Bylaws, an open recruitment is held every two years to fill the two parent representative member positions, to serve a two-year term beginning the following January. The recruitment was open for a five-week period. A total of eight applications were received. One applicant requested their application to be withdrawn.

A Selection Committee comprised of Committee Members Schwartze, von dem Bussche, and Winn conducted candidate interviews on September 18, 2018. The Selection Committee recommends the appointment of Joshua Arnaldo and Jenny Woo to the Committee (Attachment 2). The Community Services Commission has the authority for final approval and appointment.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION**

#### ANALYSIS

The Committee is a public advisory body reporting to the Community Services Commission. Committee members provide input and develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.

An open recruitment was conducted August 1 through September 10, 2018, to fill two Parent Representative Member positions each serving a two-year term. Marketing and outreach efforts included a City of Irvine press release, posting on the City website and child care coordination email blast to over 500 contacts. Eight applications were received, and six applicants were interviewed (one applicant asked to be withdrawn, and one applicant was ill on the interview day).

The Selection Committee recommended candidates that demonstrated awareness of child care related issues and the ability to assess, articulate, and advocate for the concerns and needs of young children and families. The background and experience of the recommended candidates closely aligns with the Committee's goals to enhance the provision of child care and early education services, provide outreach and serve as a liaison to the community as a whole.

The Committee recommends the Community Services Commission approve Joshua Arnaldo and Jenny Woo to serve as Parent Representative Members on the Committee.

Joshua Arnaldo:

- Father of two children
- Current member of the Irvine Kindergarten Articulation Committee
- Current board member of the Woodbridge Community Church, Irvine
- One of the founders of the Learning Lab Preschool at the Woodbridge Community Church

Jenny Woo:

- Mother of three children
- Founder of Mind Brain Parenting
- Director of a LePort Montessori School for four years
- Creator of "52 Essential Conversations to Inspire Children"

#### IRVINE CHILD CARE COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Community Services Resolution Number: <u>18-04</u> Community Services Commission Approved: <u>06/06/2018</u>

#### 1.0 <u>NAME</u>

The name of this advisory body of the City of Irvine shall be the Irvine Child Care Committee (hereinafter "Committee").

#### 2.0 LOCATION

The principal office for the transaction of business is hereby fixed and located at One Civic Center Plaza in Irvine, California.

#### 3.0 PURPOSE, MISSION, AND DUTIES

- 3.1 <u>Purpose</u> The Committee's purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine, reporting to the Community Services Commission (hereinafter "Commission"). The Committee shall provide input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.
- 3.2 <u>Mission</u> The Committee's mission is to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.
- 3.3 <u>Duties</u> The Committee's duties include, but shall not be limited to, working collaboratively with City departments and community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education services, providing outreach, and serving as a liaison to the community by informally sharing information learned at meetings, promoting City events for families and early childhood educators and sharing questions, concerns and ideas from the community with the Committee.
  - The Committee shall appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and one representative to serve on the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee, as appropriate.

The Committee shall report annually to the Commission on its goals and accomplishments.

#### ATTACHMENT 1

#### 4.0 GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Provisions of the Irvine Municipal Code, Title I, Division 4-Commissions and Committees, are applicable to all Commissions and Committees appointed by, or otherwise operating under authority of the City of Irvine, City Council and/or its properly appointed delegate.

#### 5.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Committee shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) voting members consisting of Appointee and Liaison representatives, and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code. Accordingly, the Membership on the Committee is comprised of representatives meeting the following requirements and procedures:

#### 5.1 Appointee Members

- 5.1.1 One representative from each of the following educational Organizations, Irvine Unified School District, University of California, Irvine, and Irvine Valley College, shall be appointed by their respective organizations and serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.
- 5.1.2 Each member of the City Council shall appoint one member to the Committee for a total of five (5) members, to serve at the pleasure of their Council Member.
- 5.2 <u>Liaison Members</u> Shall be selected through the following procedure: All interested persons who reside or are employed in the City of Irvine shall submit written applications and all applicants will be invited to an oral interview with a minimum of three (3) Committee Members and one (1) optional representative from the Community Services Commission. Term of office shall be a period of two years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.
  - 5.2.1 Community Members Two (2)
  - 5.2.2 Center- or Home-based Child Care Provider Members who operate or work in a child care program licensed by the State of California Community Care Licensing Division - Two (2)
  - 5.2.3 Parent/Guardian Members having children under the age of 12 at the time of application submittal Two (2)
- 5.3 Resignation, Vacancies, and Removal
  - 5.3.1 <u>Resignation</u> Any Committee Member or officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or Vice Chair.

- 5.3.2 <u>Vacancies</u> In the event a vacancy is created, it shall be filled by the same method by which the vacancy was previously filled, at a timeline established by the Committee.
- 5.3.3. <u>Removal</u> In the event a Committee Member fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings, the Committee may, by motion, move to remove the Committee Member from the Committee. A majority vote of the Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry such a motion.

#### 6.0 VOTING

- 6.1 One Vote Per Member Committee Members shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6.2 Proxy Votes No proxy votes are permitted.

#### 7.0 OFFICERS

Officers of the Committee shall include a Chair and a Vice Chair, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Committee. The officers shall be elected by the Committee annually.

- 7.1 <u>Election</u> Regular election of officers shall be held annually. The term of office shall be one (1) year, commencing upon election.
- 7.2 <u>Chair</u> The Chair shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this Committee. The Chair shall preside over all meetings and represent the Committee to the Commission, the City Council and City staff.
- 7.3 <u>Vice Chair</u> In the absence or resignation of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all of the duties of the Chair, and in so acting, shall have all of the authority of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Committee.

#### 8.0 MEETINGS

All meetings shall be open to the public and shall conform to the provisions of the "Ralph M. Brown Act".

- 8.1 <u>Agenda</u> Agenda items may be submitted thirty (30) days in advance by any Committee Member upon notification to the Chair or City liaison. The agenda shall be established with items as coordinated by the Chair and City liaison.
- 8.2 <u>Procedures</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the general conduct of meetings.

- 8.3 <u>Quorum</u> A majority of the Committee Members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry a motion, proposal and/or resolution.
- 8.4 <u>Regular Meetings</u> The Committee shall meet six (6) times each year per an annual schedule approved by the Committee at the last meeting of the previous year. All regular meeting agendas shall be posted in a location accessible to the public at least 72 hours before the time of the meeting and must describe the business to be transacted.
- 8.5 <u>Special Meetings</u> A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chair or by a majority of the members of the Committee, by delivering personally, by mail, or by email written notice to each member and by circulating the agenda as required by law, and by posting the agenda in a location freely accessible to the public at least 24 hours before the meeting. The special meeting notice must specify both the time and the place of the meeting and the business to be transacted.

#### 9.0 BYLAWS

Amendments to these bylaws are subject to approval and adoption by the Commission by a majority of the members present at a duly constituted meeting of the Commission.

#### IRVINE CHILD CARE COMMITTEE: JOSHUA ARNALDO

#### QUESTION: How would you approach these project(s) or Programs?

1. As a parent, I am living the frustration of trying to find good child care options. Many options are out of my price range or have waiting lists that are too long and unreasonable. Some programs are not responsive to requests or lack the resources to be able to market their services. Parents are often forced to make childcare decisions without having all the information or options to consider leading to poor placements and lost time in finding other options. In this information age, we need a better way to get child care availability information to our parents. Working with providers we can create an online portal that can help advertise live availability to parents and also highlight programs that might have been otherwise overlooked. Most parents utilize services like Yelp or Google to search for daycare options, and these options are often manipulated by marketing spend. I know there are static websites with lists of options, but we need a better way to communicate childcare services to parents in this information age. I would like to explore app-based solutions or integrate with existing child care providers. We can also utilize social media outlets and groups to advertise our services to Irvine residents.

2. We cannot improve what we cannot measure. We need to collect data and conduct surveys to determine where the young families in Irvine are located and where the need for childcare is most needed. If we can identify what areas that have the greatest need we can work with local community influencers in these areas to help determine strategies to providing affordable child care options. Newer Irvine communities have the space/opportunity to embed child care strategies in their growth plans. Older communities might need to work with established businesses or locations to provide creative child care options.

3. I have experienced firsthand the process to get a child care program licensed and there are very limited resources to help navigate the regulatory landscape of this process. If we are able to identify areas of need (Previous Point) we can work with community influencers in the area to identify next steps for providing child care options. I think if more people could have access to resources and training we would be able to start/develop better childcare options in Irvine. I would create an online portal of resources, but by also creating strategic partnerships with business and individuals throughout the community we could find ways to provide child care options that is safe, effective, and affordable.

4. There are so many different educational styles of childcare options in Irvine that can be confusing to most parents. These options sometimes limit parents because they are tied to one philosophy or another. Most parents move to Irvine because of the great school district, but the childcare options can be so different and divergent from the school district's educational philosophy. We need to find better ways of improving alignment between existing and future childcare providers and the school district and help parents understand the differences in child care options and philosophies (Montessori, Reggio, Emergent, etc.). For example, I know that the Irvine School District have started adopting the Educational Development Index as a key indicator for kindergarten. If parents were better informed on the EDI and understand what kind of childcare methodologies available to them they might be more open to explore play-based options or see the value of unstructured play times. The better parents are informed on real data, the more they might be open to all the options available to them in Irvine.

It isn't the least interesting, but the library could be utilized better. I grew up surrounded by books. Kids don't seem to read as much nowadays. It would be great to think of incentives for kids to read to get them hooked.

#### WHAT PROGRAMS/PROJECTS WOULD YOU LIKE TO SEE IMPROVED OR IMPLEMENTED?

As a mother of 2 small kids (ages 3 and 6), I would like to see more programs/events geared towards STEAM for younger children. If we could add age-appropriate STEAM materials/curriculum to kids, that would be a huge advantage for them later on. This could be implemented in Rainbow Rising as well.

It is also the trend for schools nowadays to implement Singapore Math in the curriculum. While we cannot change IUSD's curriculum, we could provide Singapore Math as an alternative in the after school programs.

Another important issue deals with the current demographics. There are more and more Asians and Asian Americans residing in Irvine, I believe there are certain issues and challenges that Asian families face that can be addressed by the Child Care Committee.

#### HOW WOULD YOU APPROACH THESE PROJECT(S) OR PROGRAM(S)? (Attach additional sheet if necessary)

For the STEAM program, we could work with existing organizations that promote STEAM to provide age-appropriate curriculum to different grades. Costa Mesa holds a STEAM carnival for kids at their fairgrounds on some years. It doesn't have to be in that magnitude, but a similar event at Great Park would be great for kids.

Another great program from a different county has older kids after school tutor younger kids and become a "big brother" or "big sister". This generates a family and warm environment for all of the kids. Younger kids feel more comfortable talking about their problems or issues to there "big brother" or "big sister".

It is also crucial to address some of the issues faced by Asian American children and families that nobody is addressing in Irvine even though the number of Asian Americans families have been increasing exponentially. Due to the language barrier, families esp. parents do not understand or are not able to get involved much. Social media tools - such as kakao, wechat, line, etc should be utilized. There are also many cultural organizations in Irvine. We can easily partner with them to reach the families.

We should also consider a mental wellness program. Many middle school and high school students feel the pressure and need to a succeed academically at the expense of their well-being, which could lead to stress, depression, or even more drastic measures. This could be prevented earlier on by reaching out to the children and the families. If there is a cultural or language barrier, we should find ways to circumvent that issue. Awareness is the first step.

## IRVINE CHILD CARE COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Community Services Resolution Number: <u>18-04</u> Community Services Commission Approved: <u>06/06/2018</u>

## 1.0 NAME

The name of this advisory body of the City of Irvine shall be the Irvine Child Care Committee (hereinafter "Committee").

### 2.0 LOCATION

The principal office for the transaction of business is hereby fixed and located at One Civic Center Plaza in Irvine, California.

#### 3.0 PURPOSE, MISSION, AND DUTIES

- 3.1 <u>Purpose</u> The Committee's purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine, reporting to the Community Services Commission (hereinafter "Commission"). The Committee shall provide input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.
- 3.2 <u>Mission</u> The Committee's mission is to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.
- 3.3 <u>Duties</u> The Committee's duties include, but shall not be limited to, working collaboratively with City departments and community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education services, providing outreach, and serving as a liaison to the community by informally sharing information learned at meetings, promoting City events for families and early childhood educators and sharing questions, concerns and ideas from the community with the Committee.

The Committee shall appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and one representative to serve on the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee, as appropriate.

The Committee shall report annually to the Commission on its goals and accomplishments.

# ATTACHMENT 2

#### 4.0 GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Provisions of the Irvine Municipal Code, Title I, Division 4-Commissions and Committees, are applicable to all Commissions and Committees appointed by, or otherwise operating under authority of the City of Irvine, City Council and/or its properly appointed delegate.

#### 5.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Committee shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) voting members consisting of Appointee and Liaison representatives, and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code. Accordingly, the Membership on the Committee is comprised of representatives meeting the following requirements and procedures:

#### 5.1 Appointee Members

- 5.1.1 One representative from each of the following educational Organizations, Irvine Unified School District, University of California, Irvine, and Irvine Valley College, shall be appointed by their respective organizations and serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.
- 5.1.2 Each member of the City Council shall appoint one member to the Committee for a total of five (5) members, to serve at the pleasure of their Council Member.
- 5.2 <u>Liaison Members</u> Shall be selected through the following procedure: All interested persons who reside or are employed in the City of Irvine shall submit written applications and all applicants will be invited to an oral interview with a minimum of three (3) Committee Members and one (1) optional representative from the Community Services Commission. Term of office shall be a period of two years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.
  - 5.2.1 Community Members Two (2)
  - 5.2.2 Center- or Home-based Child Care Provider Members who operate or work in a child care program licensed by the State of California Community Care Licensing Division - Two (2)
  - 5.2.3 Parent/Guardian Members having children under the age of 12 at the time of application submittal Two (2)
- 5.3 Resignation, Vacancies, and Removal
  - 5.3.1 <u>Resignation</u> Any Committee Member or officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or Vice Chair.

- 5.3.2 <u>Vacancies</u> In the event a vacancy is created, it shall be filled by the same method by which the vacancy was previously filled, at a timeline established by the Committee.
- 5.3.3. <u>Removal</u> In the event a Committee Member fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings, the Committee may, by motion, move to remove the Committee Member from the Committee. A majority vote of the Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry such a motion.

#### 6.0 VOTING

- 6.1 One Vote Per Member Committee Members shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6.2 <u>Proxy Votes</u> No proxy votes are permitted.

#### 7.0 OFFICERS

Officers of the Committee shall include a Chair and a Vice Chair, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Committee. The officers shall be elected by the Committee annually.

- 7.1 <u>Election</u> Regular, election of officers shall be held annually. The term of office shall be one (1) year, commencing upon election.
- 7.2 <u>Chair</u> The Chair shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this Committee. The Chair shall preside over all meetings and represent the Committee to the Commission, the City Council and City staff.
- 7.3 <u>Vice Chair</u> In the absence or resignation of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all of the duties of the Chair, and in so acting, shall have all of the authority of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Committee.

#### 8.0 MEETINGS

All meetings shall be open to the public and shall conform to the provisions of the "Ralph M. Brown Act".

- 8.1 <u>Agenda</u> Agenda items may be submitted thirty (30) days in advance by any Committee Member upon notification to the Chair or City liaison. The agenda shall be established with items as coordinated by the Chair and City liaison.
- 8.2 <u>Procedures</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the general conduct of meetings.

- 8.3 <u>Quorum</u> A majority of the Committee Members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry a motion, proposal and/or resolution.
- 8.4 <u>Regular Meetings</u> The Committee shall meet six (6) times each year per an annual schedule approved by the Committee at the last meeting of the previous year. All regular meeting agendas shall be posted in a location accessible to the public at least 72 hours before the time of the meeting and must describe the business to be transacted.
- 8.5 <u>Special Meetings</u> A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chair or by a majority of the members of the Committee, by delivering personally, by mail, or by email written notice to each member and by circulating the agenda as required by law, and by posting the agenda in a location freely accessible to the public at least 24 hours before the meeting. The special meeting notice must specify both the time and the place of the meeting and the business to be transacted.

#### 9.0 BYLAWS

Amendments to these bylaws are subject to approval and adoption by the Commission by a majority of the members present at a duly constituted meeting of the Commission.
