Re: Discussion of Subcommittee Policy Objectives

At the Green Ribbon Environmental Committee's December 10, 2018 meeting, Vice-Chair Maharramli requested the subcommittees meet to discuss the policy objectives summarized below. Staff will assist the subcommittees with development of policy objectives to incorporate into the Committee's Work Plan.

Active Transportation Subcommittee Policy Objectives:

- 1. Consider communitywide improvements to increase accessibility for bicycles
- 2. Improve the first and last mile connection to public transit hubs
- 3. Relate active transportation to public health
- 4. Explore a Bridge Plan and sidewalk infrastructure to improve walkability
- 5. Review goals for transit-oriented development
- 6. Collaborate with colleges and universities in Irvine to improve transit options for students and employees

Energy Development and Community Choice Energy (CCE) Subcommittee Policy Objectives:

- 1. Increase energy efficiency and use of renewable energy technologies at City facilities
- 2. Support communitywide roll-out of electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure, including pursuit of funding opportunities to install EV charging stations
- 3. Create incentives to engage the business community to support renewable energy technologies
- 4. Structure the CCE program to secure benefits that promote energy efficiency and renewable energy adoption communitywide

Green Infrastructure Subcommittee Policy Objectives:

 Evaluate existing green infrastructure in the City and possibilities for improvement, with particular attention to green infrastructure related to urban tree canopy (as a means of providing shade) Green Ribbon Environmental Committee January 15, 2019 Page 2 of 2

- 2. Explore the expansion of shade corridors in strategic locations throughout the City, including but not limited to streets, parks, alleys and sports fields
- 3. Incorporate community-based stewardship and research as a key feature of the Orange County Great Park and its' strategic sustainability plan, including linkages to the City's shade corridors and active transportation routes
- 4. Increase water conservation and stormwater management practices across the City's landscape, particularly in the Great Park and in any areas to be identified in a shade corridor program
