The university community remains committed to this partnership that has collaboratively addressed issues of public safety, transportation, housing, and most recently the challenges surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic.

The University of California is dedicated to the principles of academic freedom to help us serve our mission to discover knowledge and disseminate it to our students and to society at large. The principles of academic freedom protect faculty members' freedom of inquiry and research, freedom of teaching, and freedom of expression and publication in their University roles, which includes the faculty addressed in your correspondence.

When conducting research outside of university programs, faculty are instructed to make clear that the positions they are expressing are their own and not those of the University. The use of university letterhead expressing the faculty's personal interest was not consistent with university policy, and we apologize for any confusion the correspondence may have caused.
