

The City of Irvine will offer financial assistance for unpaid rent due to the impact of COVID-19.



The City of Irvine's Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) will offer Irvine's residential renters assistance in covering back rent owed from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021 through a \$17.7 million grant from the state and federal government.

If the landlord agrees to forgive 20% of the back rent, the program will grant the remaining 80% owed by the tenant to the landlord. If the landlord does not wish to participate in forgiving the 20% unpaid rent, the tenant will receive 25% of the back rent for rental assistance.

Lottery selection will be conducted soon after the application closure date with staff targeting on or around March 23, 2021.

Eligibility Requirements Include:

- Must be at or below 80% Area Median Income (however, per State guidelines, below 50% Area Median Income will be prioritized first).
- Must be a residential renter in the City of Irvine.
- Must have a current and valid lease or proof of rent payment history.
- ▶ Renter must demonstrate a financial hardship as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Must not have received other rental assistance from any governmental agency, including Section 8 vouchers; individuals that received grant assistance in the City's previous Rental Assistance Program are eligible to apply.
