2018 Data for Irvine Compared to Orange County Next Steps - Mapping Update and 2022 Data Collection





Early Development Index (EDI) is:

A teacher-rated measure of kindergarten children's readiness to learn at school in five areas of early childhood development

- → Observational Checklist
- Completed by Kinder Teacher second half of school year
- → Reported at group level
- → NOT reported on individual children
- → NOT used as screening or diagnostic tool

1. Cynthia Rodriguez, Community Liaison for Help Me Grow Orange County, presented Understanding Developmental Screening and the use of Evidence-Based Tools along with an overview of services provided by Help Me Grow.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Traci Stubbler, Commnity Services Supervisor, announced the following:

- On April 27, the Irvine City Council awarded \$60,389 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Services Funding to Irvine Children's Fund (ICF) to support the ICCP Scholarship Program for the 2021-22 Fiscal Year. In addition, the Irvine City Council awarded \$979,821 in one-time CDBG Coronavirus Funding to ICF to support families whom the pandemic has negatively impacted economically.
- On March 19, 2021, Community Care Licensing Division released new guidance allowing child care providers operating in Counties in the red, orange, or yellow tiers to serve more children in each classroom. This change will allow most programs to increase enrollment capacities for summer and fall 2021, though not yet to their full pre-COVID-19 licensed capacities.
- Drive-through vaccinations continue to be available at the Orange County Great Park Monday through Friday. For appointments, visit myturn.ca.gov or call 1-833-422-4255.
- COVID-19 testing is available for free at five City of Irvine facilities in partnership with operator 360 Clinic announces the grand opening of five free COVID-19 testing at various City facilities.

Diana Magallón, Community Services Program Coordinator, announced the following:

- The South Coast Chinese Cultural Center will be opening its new mandarin immersion preschool this summer for children ages 3-5. The new program is licensed for 40 children.
- On Thursday, May 6, the Child Care Coordination Office held its first virtual family child care provider workshop. Twelve family child care providers participated in the event on marketing their programs during the pandemic.
