

- On July 9, 2021, the United States Secretary of Labor, Marty Walsh, joined by Congresswoman Katie Porter, visited Meadow Park Rainbow Rising to highlight how family-friendly policies boost the economy by making it easier for parents to participate in the workforce.
- Build Up California is hosting a series of virtual Roundtable events focused on Improving Child Care Facilities and Physical Spaces Using Federal Relief Dollars. Information about this series and many excellent virtual and on-demand training opportunities are available online at the City of Irvine on the Child Care and Development Training and On-Demand webpages.
- The Orange County Emergency Child Care Task Force is putting together a Child Care Provider Appreciation event. The event is to recognize the many providers that have been working tirelessly throughout the pandemic. Members of the committee will be invited to volunteer at the event.

Diana Magallón, Community Services Program Coordinator, announced the following:

- On June 29, 2021, State Community Care Licensing Division in conjunction with the California Department of Public Health released new Child Care Industry Guidance allowing child care providers to resume operations to licensed capacity while providing guidance for best practices. Children and adults in licensed programs must continue to wear face coverings while indoors.
- The recruitment for two center-based or home-based childcare providers, and two community member representatives on the Committee opened on August 6. Applications must be completed and submitted online by 5 p.m. on Thursday, September 16. Interviews are scheduled for September 21. Committee members Clatterbuck, Young, and Mai have volunteered to conduct the interviews and serve on the selection committee. Their recommendations will be brought to the next Committee Meeting in October.

Recommend the Community Services Commission approve the appointment of Diane Gale and reappointment of Imithri Bodhinayake to serve as Community Representatives, and Donna Schwartze and Jessica Winn to serve as Center- or Home-based Child Care Providers on the Irvine Child Care Committee from January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2023.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Irvine Child Care Committee (Committee) was established in 1987, and its purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine by providing input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.

In accordance with Committee Bylaws (Attachment 1), the volunteer Committee is comprised of 14 voting members consisting of Liaison and Appointee representatives. The six Liaison members represent two community representatives, two center- or homebased child care providers, and two parent/guardian members. The eight Appointee members represent three educational organizations and five City Council appointees.

An open recruitment is held every two years to fill the two community representative member positions, and two center- or home-based child care providers; to serve a twoyear term beginning the following January. The recruitment was open from August 6, 2021 to September 16, 2021. Four candidates from the nine applications received are being recommended for appointment to the Committee.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

A Selection Committee comprised of Committee Members Lin, Mai, and Young conducted candidate interviews on September 21, 2021. The Selection Committee recommends the appointment of Diane Gale and reappointment of Imithri Bodhinayake, Jessica Winn, and Donna Schwartze, to the Committee. The Community Services Commission has the authority for final approval and appointment.

ANALYSIS

The Committee is a public advisory body reporting to the Community Services Commission. Committee members provide input and develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.

An open recruitment was conducted August 6 through September 16, 2021, to fill two Community Representative Member positions, and two Center- or Home-based Child Care Providers, each serving two-year terms. Marketing and outreach efforts included a City of Irvine press release, a posting on the City website, and child care coordination email blast to over 600 contacts. Nine applications were received, and eight applicants were interviewed, one withdrew.

The Selection Committee recommended candidates that demonstrated awareness of child care related issues and the ability to assess, articulate, and advocate for the concerns and needs of young children and families. The background and experience of the recommended candidates closely aligned with the Committee's goals to enhance child care and early education, provide resources and, serve as a liaison to the community as a whole.

The Committee recommends the Community Services Commission approve Imithri Bodhinayake and Diane Gale as Community Representative Members, and Jessica Winn and Donna Schwartze as Center- or Home-based Child Care Providers, to serve on the Committee.

- Imithri Bodhinayake is a 12-year resident of Irvine, and parent of two young children. Dr. Bodhinayake, a Physician, was selected based on her unique perspective as the daughter of an early childhood educator and a working parent. She is aware of the unique requirements and responsibilities of child care providers and the needs and priorities of families with young children. Dr. Bodhinayake is passionate about increasing the visibility of existing Irvine programs and resources, and connecting with families new to Irvine.
- **Diane Gale** is a 21-year resident of Irvine, and is currently a member of the Irvine Children, Youth, and Families Advisory Committee. Ms. Gale, an Occupational Therapist, serves as Vice President on the Board of the Congregation B'nai Israel Preschool. Ms. Gale is passionate about bringing awareness to the needs of children with special needs, and providing educational forums and workshops for child care providers in the community.
- Jessica Winn is a 30-year resident of Irvine, and parent of a three year old child. Ms. Winn is the Director of the Rainbow Rising Program at Loma Ridge Elementary School, and an active volunteer with various non-profit organizations in Orange County. Ms. Winn brings a unique perspective as the parent of a young child, and experience working in the school age child care field. She is looking forward to working with the Committee to bring resources to young families, and to enhance

professional growth opportunities for early care and education professionals in Irvine.

• **Donna Schwartze** is a 42-year Irvine resident, and mother of three adult children. Ms. Schwartze, the Director of the Irvine Community Nursery School, was selected based on her extensive experience as a Mentor Teacher, Director, and Instructor of Early Childhood Education. Ms. Schwartze is passionate about learning and sharing resources with parents in the community.

Redacted applications for the recommended candidates are presented as Attachment 2.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The Committee may consider not appointing the recommended candidates or request a new recruitment process.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

IRVINE CHILD CARE COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Community Services Resolution Number: <u>18-04</u> Community Services Commission Approved: <u>06/06/2018</u>

1.0 <u>NAME</u>

The name of this advisory body of the City of Irvine shall be the Irvine Child Care Committee (hereinafter "Committee").

2.0 LOCATION

The principal office for the transaction of business is hereby fixed and located at One Civic Center Plaza in Irvine, California.

3.0 PURPOSE, MISSION, AND DUTIES

- 3.1 <u>Purpose</u> The Committee's purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine, reporting to the Community Services Commission (hereinafter "Commission"). The Committee shall provide input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.
- 3.2 <u>Mission</u> The Committee's mission is to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.
- 3.3 <u>Duties</u> The Committee's duties include, but shall not be limited to, working collaboratively with City departments and community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education services, providing outreach, and serving as a liaison to the community by informally sharing information learned at meetings, promoting City events for families and early childhood educators and sharing questions, concerns and ideas from the community with the Committee.

The Committee shall appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and one representative to serve on the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee, as appropriate.

The Committee shall report annually to the Commission on its goals and accomplishments.

ATTACHMENT 1

4.0 GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Provisions of the Irvine Municipal Code, Title I, Division 4-Commissions and Committees, are applicable to all Commissions and Committees appointed by, or otherwise operating under authority of the City of Irvine, City Council and/or its properly appointed delegate.

5.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Committee shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) voting members consisting of Appointee and Liaison representatives, and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code. Accordingly, the Membership on the Committee is comprised of representatives meeting the following requirements and procedures:

5.1 Appointee Members

- 5.1.1 One representative from each of the following educational Organizations, Irvine Unified School District, University of California, Irvine, and Irvine Valley College, shall be appointed by their respective organizations and serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.
- 5.1.2 Each member of the City Council shall appoint one member to the Committee for a total of five (5) members, to serve at the pleasure of their Council Member.
- 5.2 <u>Liaison Members</u> Shall be selected through the following procedure: All interested persons who reside or are employed in the City of Irvine shall submit written applications and all applicants will be invited to an oral interview with a minimum of three (3) Committee Members and one (1) optional representative from the Community Services Commission. Term of office shall be a period of two years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.
 - 5.2.1 Community Members Two (2)
 - 5.2.2 Center- or Home-based Child Care Provider Members who operate or work in a child care program licensed by the State of California Community Care Licensing Division - Two (2)
 - 5.2.3 Parent/Guardian Members having children under the age of 12 at the time of application submittal Two (2)
- 5.3 Resignation, Vacancies, and Removal
 - 5.3.1 <u>Resignation</u> Any Committee Member or officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or Vice Chair.

- 5.3.2 <u>Vacancies</u> In the event a vacancy is created, it shall be filled by the same method by which the vacancy was previously filled, at a timeline established by the Committee.
- 5.3.3. <u>Removal</u> In the event a Committee Member fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings, the Committee may, by motion, move to remove the Committee Member from the Committee. A majority vote of the Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry such a motion.

6.0 <u>VOTING</u>

- 6.1 <u>One Vote Per Member</u> Committee Members shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6.2 <u>Proxy Votes</u> No proxy votes are permitted.

7.0 OFFICERS

Officers of the Committee shall include a Chair and a Vice Chair, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Committee. The officers shall be elected by the Committee annually.

- 7.1 <u>Election</u> Regular election of officers shall be held annually. The term of office shall be one (1) year, commencing upon election.
- 7.2 <u>Chair</u> The Chair shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this Committee. The Chair shall preside over all meetings and represent the Committee to the Commission, the City Council and City staff.
- 7.3 <u>Vice Chair</u> In the absence or resignation of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all of the duties of the Chair, and in so acting, shall have all of the authority of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Committee.

8.0 MEETINGS

All meetings shall be open to the public and shall conform to the provisions of the "Ralph M. Brown Act".

- 8.1 <u>Agenda</u> Agenda items may be submitted thirty (30) days in advance by any Committee Member upon notification to the Chair or City liaison. The agenda shall be established with items as coordinated by the Chair and City liaison.
- 8.2 <u>Procedures</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the general conduct of meetings.

- 8.3 <u>Quorum</u> A majority of the Committee Members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry a motion, proposal and/or resolution.
- 8.4 <u>Regular Meetings</u> The Committee shall meet six (6) times each year per an annual schedule approved by the Committee at the last meeting of the previous year. All regular meeting agendas shall be posted in a location accessible to the public at least 72 hours before the time of the meeting and must describe the business to be transacted.
- 8.5 <u>Special Meetings</u> A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chair or by a majority of the members of the Committee, by delivering personally, by mail, or by email written notice to each member and by circulating the agenda as required by law, and by posting the agenda in a location freely accessible to the public at least 24 hours before the meeting. The special meeting notice must specify both the time and the place of the meeting and the business to be transacted.

9.0 BYLAWS

Amendments to these bylaws are subject to approval and adoption by the Commission by a majority of the members present at a duly constituted meeting of the Commission.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Irvine Child Care Committee (Committee) was established in 1987 and their purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine by providing input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.

The Committee is comprised of 14 voting members consisting of Liaison and Appointee representatives. The six Liaison members represent two community representatives, two center- or home-based child care providers, and two parent/guardian members. The eight Appointee members represent three educational organizations, and five City Council appointees.

The Committee meets six times per year to network and share information on child care policies and programs, disseminate information to the community, and plan and implement annual child care provider training conferences, and community education forums.

COMMISSION/BOARD/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Not applicable.

ANALYSIS

The Committee is a public advisory body reporting to the Community Services Commission. Committee members provide input and develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.

Committee meetings are held the second Tuesday of select months at Heritage Park Community Center, 14301 Yale Avenue, Irvine, California, from 9-10:30 a.m., unless otherwise noted. Meetings may be held virtually as a result of the COVID-19 Virus, and resulting orders and direction from the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of California, the Orange County Health Care Agency, as well as the City of Irvine. IRVINE CHILD CARE COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Community Services Resolution Number: <u>18-04</u> Community Services Commission Approved: <u>06/06/2018</u>

1.0 <u>NAME</u>

The name of this advisory body of the City of Irvine shall be the Irvine Child Care Committee (hereinafter "Committee").

2.0 LOCATION

The principal office for the transaction of business is hereby fixed and located at One Civic Center Plaza in Irvine, California.

3.0 PURPOSE, MISSION, AND DUTIES

- 3.1 <u>Purpose</u> The Committee's purpose is to serve as an advisory body of the City of Irvine, reporting to the Community Services Commission (hereinafter "Commission"). The Committee shall provide input on the needs of the community pertaining to child care related issues.
- 3.2 <u>Mission</u> The Committee's mission is to develop recommendations related to the availability of affordable quality child care and early education in Irvine.
- 3.3 <u>Duties</u> The Committee's duties include, but shall not be limited to, working collaboratively with City departments and community organizations to enhance the provision of child care and early education services, providing outreach, and serving as a liaison to the community by informally sharing information learned at meetings, promoting City events for families and early childhood educators and sharing questions, concerns and ideas from the community with the Committee.

The Committee shall appoint one representative from their membership to serve on the Irvine Child Development Center Operating Board and one representative to serve on the Irvine Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee, as appropriate.

The Committee shall report annually to the Commission on its goals and accomplishments.

ATTACHMENT 2

4.0 GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Provisions of the Irvine Municipal Code, Title I, Division 4-Commissions and Committees, are applicable to all Commissions and Committees appointed by, or otherwise operating under authority of the City of Irvine, City Council and/or its properly appointed delegate.

5.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Committee shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) voting members consisting of Appointee and Liaison representatives, and shall serve pursuant to Section 5310 of the California Organizations Code. Accordingly, the Membership on the Committee is comprised of representatives meeting the following requirements and procedures:

5.1 Appointee Members

- 5.1.1 One representative from each of the following educational Organizations, Irvine Unified School District, University of California, Irvine, and Irvine Valley College, shall be appointed by their respective organizations and serve a term of office in accordance with that appointment.
- 5.1.2 Each member of the City Council shall appoint one member to the Committee for a total of five (5) members, to serve at the pleasure of their Council Member.
- 5.2 <u>Liaison Members</u> Shall be selected through the following procedure: All interested persons who reside or are employed in the City of Irvine shall submit written applications and all applicants will be invited to an oral interview with a minimum of three (3) Committee Members and one (1) optional representative from the Community Services Commission. Term of office shall be a period of two years. Reappointment to another term is possible by complying with the procedure outlined herein.
 - 5.2.1 Community Members Two (2)
 - 5.2.2 Center- or Home-based Child Care Provider Members who operate or work in a child care program licensed by the State of California Community Care Licensing Division - Two (2)
 - 5.2.3 Parent/Guardian Members having children under the age of 12 at the time of application submittal Two (2)
- 5.3 Resignation, Vacancies, and Removal
 - 5.3.1 <u>Resignation</u> Any Committee Member or officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair or Vice Chair.

- 5.3.2 <u>Vacancies</u> In the event a vacancy is created, it shall be filled by the same method by which the vacancy was previously filled, at a timeline established by the Committee.
- 5.3.3. <u>Removal</u> In the event a Committee Member fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings, the Committee may, by motion, move to remove the Committee Member from the Committee. A majority vote of the Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry such a motion.

6.0 <u>VOTING</u>

- 6.1 <u>One Vote Per Member</u> Committee Members shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6.2 <u>Proxy Votes</u> No proxy votes are permitted.

7.0 OFFICERS

Officers of the Committee shall include a Chair and a Vice Chair, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Committee. The officers shall be elected by the Committee annually.

- 7.1 <u>Election</u> Regular election of officers shall be held annually. The term of office shall be one (1) year, commencing upon election.
- 7.2 <u>Chair</u> The Chair shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction, and control of the business and affairs of this Committee. The Chair shall preside over all meetings and represent the Committee to the Commission, the City Council and City staff.
- 7.3 <u>Vice Chair</u> In the absence or resignation of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all of the duties of the Chair, and in so acting, shall have all of the authority of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Committee.

8.0 MEETINGS

All meetings shall be open to the public and shall conform to the provisions of the "Ralph M. Brown Act".

- 8.1 <u>Agenda</u> Agenda items may be submitted thirty (30) days in advance by any Committee Member upon notification to the Chair or City liaison. The agenda shall be established with items as coordinated by the Chair and City liaison.
- 8.2 <u>Procedures</u> Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the general conduct of meetings.

- 8.3 <u>Quorum</u> A majority of the Committee Members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of Committee Members present at a duly constituted meeting shall be required to carry a motion, proposal and/or resolution.
- 8.4 <u>Regular Meetings</u> The Committee shall meet six (6) times each year per an annual schedule approved by the Committee at the last meeting of the previous year. All regular meeting agendas shall be posted in a location accessible to the public at least 72 hours before the time of the meeting and must describe the business to be transacted.
- 8.5 <u>Special Meetings</u> A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chair or by a majority of the members of the Committee, by delivering personally, by mail, or by email written notice to each member and by circulating the agenda as required by law, and by posting the agenda in a location freely accessible to the public at least 24 hours before the meeting. The special meeting notice must specify both the time and the place of the meeting and the business to be transacted.

9.0 BYLAWS

Amendments to these bylaws are subject to approval and adoption by the Commission by a majority of the members present at a duly constituted meeting of the Commission.
