Senior Council Member Baradehi reported Ericka Danczak, Office on Aging and Veterans Services, provided updates on social services bills moving through legislation.

Senior Council Member Ragland reported on a new library program being offered where live presenters can be "checked out" for 30 minutes to provide presentations at meetings.

B. Wellbeing Reimagined

Senior Council Member Baradehi reported Nasira Cooley, a registered dietitian, provided a "Food and the Brain" presentation highlighting how diet fuels and affects brain function.

C. Housing/Transportation – No Report.

C. Irvine Adult Day Health Services, Inc. (IADHS)

Kimberly Beeson, Executive Director, reported the following:

- Participation is up to 15.4% from 13.7% with nine to 21 participants in facility on any given day.
- Four new participants enrolled this month.
- Telehealth services have been extended to June 30; utilized by two participants, most are on-site; social distancing and use of masks still required.
- IADHS awarded \$47,000 in Community Development Block Grant funds; working on next fiscal year's budget and developing fundraising goals.
- The annual fundraising gala, Take a Chance on Seniors, has been scheduled for October 1.

D. Senior Citizens Engagement

Senior Council Member Suh reported:

 Sgt. James Vogel, Orange County Sheriff's Department, provided a presentation on fraud and elder abuse prevention at the April 18 meeting.

- The California Senior Legislature will host Senior Rally Day on May 3 as an on-line event.
- World Elder Abuse Awareness Day will be observed on June 15.

Chair Sandlin reported updated provided during the March 21 meeting and provided a handout.

B. Nutrition Committee

Senior Council Member Baradehi reported:

- Congregate meal program has lifted mask policy.
- Advance reservations are still required, but issues with no-show and lack of notifications of cancelation.
- Voluntary donations have declined and staff working on ways to promote.

Vice Chair Owens reported there is no mandatory fee for meals in the café, and suggested donations are accepted upon entry.

Manager Hilderbrand reported:

- City Council will consider the removal of vaccination requirements at its May 24 meeting.
- The Grab and Go program will be phased out; goal to resume full capacity congregate meals is June 1.
- Researching logistics to begin offering Meals on Wheels out of Rancho Senior Center and Trabuco Center.

C. Senior Plan for Aging

Senior Council Member Ragland reported subcommittees were established as follows:

- Policy Committee members given list of legislators to contact to advocate for policies.
- Social Engagement Committee to promote social interaction, friendly visitor programs, or the likes of Irvine's CHAMPIONS program.
- Elder Abuse Prevention Committee presentation scheduled for June 16 at the Lakeview Senior Center from 9-11 a.m.
- Nutrition Committee to promote enrollment in Cal Fresh program.
- Behavioral Health Committee to address lack of mental health component in the Master Plan.
- Technology Committee to promote use of technology by seniors.
