

The City of Irvine is developing its first Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP) to set the City on an accelerated pathway to carbon neutrality and build resilience to climate change hazards. The CAAP builds upon the City's history of climate leadership in Orange County to create a climate-safe future for our children and grandchildren.



Carbon neutrality refers to netzero emissions of climate-warming gases; it's a condition in which the amount of emissions generated equals the amount removed from the atmosphere or eliminated elsewhere.

Overview

The CAAP will guide the City's actions to achieve ambitious reductions in climate-warming greenhouse gas emissions from City operations and community activities, including driving cars and trucks, using energy in homes, businesses, and other buildings, disposing of waste, using water, and managing open spaces. The CAAP will also recommend ways that the City can adapt to current and future climate-related impacts, like wildfires, extreme heat events, drought, extreme rain and flooding. The CAAP will:

- Identify existing sources of climate pollution and the amount of greenhouse gas emissions generated from each;
- Describe the climate change hazards that threaten the City;
- **Estimate** future emissions levels if no City actions were taken;
- Establish targets for reducing climate pollution;
- Include actions to reduce climate pollution to meet the targets; and
- Recommend ways to protect people and property from climate-related hazards.


