

What is Measure D?

Measure D, also known as the Council Expansion and Districting charter amendment, gives Irvine voters the opportunity to decide whether to expand the City Council from five to seven members and transition to district elections.

Measure D will appear on the ballot in this Special Municipal Election as follows:

"Shall a City Charter amendment that (i) increases the membership of the City Council from five to seven, with the new membership comprised of a mayor and six Council members, and (ii) provides for the transition from at-large elections to by-district elections for the six Council members, with the district boundaries as described in City Council Resolution No. 23-88, be adopted?"

What is required for Measure D to pass?

If more than 50% of residents vote in favor of this change, the City of Irvine will transition to district-based elections to elect City Councilmembers starting with the November 2024 election cycle. The Mayor would continue to serve at-large.

If Measure D passes, what happens next?

In 2024, voters in Districts 2, 3, and 4 would elect Councilmembers for full four-year terms. Voters in District 1 would elect a Councilmember for a short two-year term. In 2026, voters in Districts 1, 5, and 6 would elect Councilmembers to represent their respective districts for full four-year terms.

What district would I reside in if Measure D is approved?

How can I vote?

Vote-by-mail ballots have been mailed to all registered Irvine voters. You can return your ballot early by mail or a ballot drop box throughout Orange County. Beginning February 24, you can cast your vote at any Vote Center in Orange County. Find a list of voting locations at *cityofirvine.org/election*.
