Community Services Senior Leader Nature Center Naturalist - Turtle Rock

The City of Irvine seeks an experienced, customer-service oriented individual to coordinate and perform the maintenance and restoration of trails at the Turtle Rock Nature Center. This person will manage fieldwork, oversee volunteers, act as a project manager for volunteer projects, lead educational hikes, facilitate campouts and provide facility operations support.

Hours: 30-32 hours per week; Occasional weekend and holidays required.

Your Impact:

- Assist in supervising part-time staff and volunteers by coordinating program activities, delegating assignments, establishing timelines and providing guidance and feedback.
- Lead and motivate volunteer groups on trail maintenance duties and restoration projects.
- Regularly perform trail maintenance including manual control of weeds, nonnative plant eradication, restoration planting and monitoring of trails, habitats and waterways.
- Perform field and site maintenance duties in variable and steep terrain; perform strenuous physical exertion and manual labor in an outdoor environment with exposure to various degrees of dirt, dust, insects and the elements.
- Develop liaison relationships with volunteer organizations, schools, community and environmental groups.
- Provide operational support, information and customer service to participants and visitors of the Nature Center.
- Implement recreational programs, family campouts, environmental programs and outreach efforts to include the new Nature Center Vegetable Garden.
- Assist with nature-based enrichment programs and events for residents of all ages, interests and cultural backgrounds.
- Research, analyze and prepare various reports and statistical data.

Best Fit:

- Excellent customer service and communication skills. Ability to respond to
 potentially intense, sensitive emergency situations in a rational and decisive
 manner, using tact, self-restraint, and good judgment.
- Familiarity with the flora and plant communities of the region; Experience with the safe use and maintenance of field tools and equipment.
- Ability to recommend and carry out scientifically-sound decisions relative to species and habitat conservation.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office and registration/reservation software.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Two years college or university level work in environmental science, ecology, plant science, horticulture, natural resource management or related field; three years of applicable experience, or any combination that provides equivalent knowledge, skills, and abilities.
- Ability to push, pull, or carry equipment/supplies (weighing up to 50 lbs.), and lean, stoop, and twist in the performance of duties.
