1.1 Distinguished Service Award: Anne Tipping

Vice Chair Baradehi presented this award to Anne Tipping for her dedicated service to the Senior Services Nutrition Program, volunteering 540 hours in 2023.

1.2 Safe Options for Seniors (SOS)

Mieka Bledsoe, Human Options Supervisor, provided a presentation on the specialized SOS program created to respond to unique needs of individuals experiencing family violence among the older adult population.

Discussion included: funding source; referral process; additional shelter options when SOS shelter is full.

Rachel Owens, resident and Orange County Older Adults Advisory Commission (OCOAAC) member, provided the following update from the March 8 OCOAAC meeting:

- Outreach goal to improve communication of services to all county residents has resulted in creation of a new Office on Aging mobile app, OC Senior Resources.
- Additional outreach goal is to provide OCOAAC presentations at future Senior Council meetings or at senior center activities as schedules permit.
- Thanked Senior Council members who attended the 2024-2028 Area Plan public hearing meeting on March 8.

STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ryan McGraw, Community Services Superintendent, announced over the past several months, City staff has continued working with Irvine Adult Day Health Services (IADHS) to help stabilize operations. Since IADHS notified the City of the intent to shut down in July 2023, the City has provided enhanced staffing support and updated grant funding agreements to ensure adequate financial resources to remain open. The City has also facilitated introductions to various individuals and groups to support IADHS in updating its overall governance structure. Additionally, IADHS has connected with the City's Communications & Engagement Department to explore new marketing strategies for promoting the center's services. IADHS has recently hired a new Executive Director, Heather Stratman. Heather will attend the April Senior Council meeting to provide updates.

Amber Castrey, Community Services Supervisor, made the following announcements:

 The AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program provides free tax assistance with a focus on taxpayers age 50 and over of low-to-moderate income. Services are provided by a team of trained and certified volunteers at Lakeview Senior Center every Wednesday, now through April 10. For additional information, or to make an appointment, contact the Keen Center for Senior Resources at 949-724-6926 or by registering at yourirvine.org.

- Jumpstart fitness goals by joining the Spring into Health Fitness Challenge. Sign up for this six-week challenge, occurring April 1 through May 10, where the more you exercise, the more opportunities you have to win prizes. Participants will receive a weekly e-newsletter featuring fitness-related educational topics, healthy recipes, and more. Register by April 8 to receive your first Challenge Card.  older adults the opportunity to visit popular destinations without the stress of driving,
 parking, or even planning. Each trip includes roundtrip transportation on a deluxe
 motorcoach, a tour guide, admission, and all gratuities. The first trip will be to the
 Huntington Library in San Marino on Thursday, April 25. Registration is required at
