PUBLIC COMMENTS - NON-AGENDIZED ITEMS

Public comments on non-agendized items will be heard no sooner than 9 a.m. Any member of the public may address the Senior Citizens Council on items within the Senior Citizens Council's subject matter jurisdiction but which are not listed on this agenda. If 20 or fewer requests to provide public comments are submitted, each speaker shall be limited to three minutes. If between 21 and 30 speakers submit public comments, each speaker shall be limited to two minutes. If more than 30 speakers submit public comments, each speaker shall be limited to 90 seconds. The time limit per speaker shall be established based on the number of requests to speak submitted to the Recording Secretary before the first speaker is called. Requests to speak submitted after the first speaker is called shall receive 90 seconds. These time limits may be shortened or extended, or a cumulative limit on the time for all public speakers may be imposed, at the discretion of the Chair or by a majority vote of the Senior Citizens Council.

City Councilmember Kathleen Treseder presented a proclamation to the Senior Council, declaring May 2024 as Older Americans Month.

1. PRESENTATIONS

Vice Chair Baradehi presented this award to Sarah Mar for her dedicated service to Senior Services programs and the Irvine Multicultural Association over the past 27 years.

1.2 Five Wishes Program

Ginelle Ng, Community Services Program Specialist, presented on behalf of Aging with Dignity on its Five Wishes Program. Booklets and informational materials were provided.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - NON-AGENDIZED ITEMS

Badri Tabibzadeh, Secretary for NEDA Association of Iranian American Seniors (NEDA), shared updates on programs and activities. NEDA meets weekly on Thursday afternoons at Lakeview Senior Center and offers a monthly evening social on the third Thursday of each month, everyone is invited.

Debra Miller Osorio, resident, spoke on the following:

- Expressed appreciation for the new Irvine Connect transportation service, and inquired about possible expansion from Trabuco to Great Park.
- Expressed concerns regarding alleged unsafe use of eBikes around high traffic areas of the senior centers and safety of seniors.

- The Northwood Gratitude and Honor Candle Lighting Ceremony will be on May 26 at Northwood Community Park at 5 p.m. Early arrival is recommended, with lawn chairs or blankets for seating, to honor those who gave their lives in service to our country.
- The City's annual Memorial Day Ceremony will be held on May 27 from 10 to 11:30 a.m. in the formal garden at Colonel Bill Barber Marine Corps Memorial Park.
- The 30th annual Studio Arts Festival will be held on June 1 at the Irvine Fine Arts Center in Heritage Community Park. Stop by this free event any time between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to shop among handmade original works of art from more than 100 local artists.
- Lakeview Senior Center will be the site for Better Together on June 29 from 10 a.m. to noon. Participants ages 10 and older are invited to enjoy a morning filled with fun activities, an opportunity drawing, and more. Whether you are 10 or 110, there is something for everyone. SENIOR COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENTS/UPDATES

Senior Council Member Jacknik announced the Planning Commission will consider proposals to general plan updates to add 57,656 new housing units over the next 10 years at its May 16 meeting.

Senior Council Member Sandlin announced the following:

- Extended an invitation to the Northwood Gratitude and Honor Candle Lighting Ceremony to those in attendance. Event will feature presentation of flags to families of fallen soldiers.
- Encouraged attendance at the May 16 Planning Commission meeting to learn about proposed projects to add 57,656 new housing units in Irvine and the potential impacts.

Chair Jacobs announced a Friends of Outreach fundraiser has been planned for May 21 at the California Fish Grill located in the Crossroads Shopping Center from 4-8 p.m., whereby 25% of proceeds will be donated to Friends of Outreach in support of Services programs.

2. COMMITTEE/GROUP/AGENCY REPORTS

2.1 ORANGE COUNTY OLDER ADULTS ADVISORY COMMISSION (OCOAAC)

Senior Council Member Jacknik reported the following information from the May 10 OCOAAC meeting:

- A presentation on the County of Orange Legislative Process was provided and reviewed how bills are created, presented, and moved through approval process.
- OCOAAC passed a motion to review and possibly support Senate Bill 37 (Older Adults and Adults with Disabilities Housing Sustainability Act).
- OCOAAC deferred action regarding Assembly Bill 2428 (Medi-Cal: Community Based Adult Services) in order to obtain more information.
- OCOAAC Senior Center Liaisons developed a questionnaire for Commissioners to learn about services provided throughout county senior centers.
- OCOAAC has developed a draft of its goals and objectives for 2024-2025 and will be presented for approval at its June meeting.
- The county Board of Supervisors proclaimed May 2024 as Older Americans Month at its May 7 meeting.
- There have been issues with callers accessing resources and services through the Office on Aging 800 phone number, it was suggested that local residents use 714-480-6450.
- It was announced that former Irvine Senior Council Member Rachel Owens will be honored on Irvine's Wall of Recognition during an installation ceremony on June 11.

2.2 SENIOR CITIZENS COUNCIL NUTRITION SUBCOMMITTEE

Vice Chair Baradehi stated there was no meeting, but a tasting of new menu items was provided.
