RECOMMENDED ACTION

Elect Steven Alves and Ed Crofts to serve as Directors of the Irvine Community Alliance Fund.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Irvine Community Alliance Fund (ICAF) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization established to receive and distribute funds to assist in the charitable provision of public parks, recreation, and community services for the City of Irvine.

In accordance with Section 4c of the ICAF Bylaws, vacancies on the Board of Directors may be filled by election or designation. Community Directors shall be elected by a majority vote of the board of directors following an application process. Twelve candidates applied for the vacant Director position with eleven candidates participating in interviews on May 15, 2024 (one candidate canceled the morning of the interviews). After interviewing candidates, the interview panel recommended the election of Steven Alves and Ed Crofts to serve as Directors on the ICAF Board. The redacted applications for the recommended candidates are attached.

ANALYSIS

The Irvine Community Alliance Fund (ICAF) is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public and charitable purposes. Per the Bylaws, the specific purposes for which ICAF was organized are:

To raise, receive and distribute funds, property and other resources to aid, sponsor, promote, advance and assist in the charitable provision of public parks, recreation and community services in and for the City of Irvine and the greater Irvine area.

The ICAF was created to link individuals, organizations and businesses desiring to raise funds in support of City of Irvine Community Services Department programs and services. It is neither the intent nor the practice of the ICAF to define program needs and initiate

fund raising. Rather, interested parties identify a program or service need, then "affiliate" with the ICAF to facilitate fund raising efforts that they design and implement.

The ICAF Board of Directors (Board) is made up of City Directors and Community Directors. The authorized number of directors shall be not less than seven nor more than nine. At least three of the members of the board of directors shall be employees of the City of Irvine (City Directors), while the majority of the remaining members shall be non-City employees (Community Directors). There are currently three City Directors and three Community Directors, requiring the election of one additional Community Director.

The recruitment process to fill the vacant Community Director positions began April 8, 2024, with publication of a news release on the City website and in local newspapers. Upon closure of the application process, twelve applications were received, and interviews were conducted on May 15, 2024, by a panel made up of three ICAF Directors. Steven Alves and Ed Crofts are recommended for election based on their professional expertise and community involvement.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The Board may choose to not accept the recommendation of the interview panel, elect other candidates, recommend further interviews of the candidates, or request a new recruitment process be initiated.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The ICAF Board of Directors serve as volunteers, and there is no budgetary impact for the election.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Irvine Community Alliance Fund (ICAF) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit entity that receives and distributes funds, property, and other resources to aid, sponsor, promote, advance, and assist in the charitable provision of public parks, recreation, and community services in and for the City of Irvine and greater Irvine area. ICAF is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of community volunteers and City of Irvine staff representatives.

In accordance with ICAF Bylaws, the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of the organization is responsible for records of accounts and for preparing the Annual Report regarding the financial condition of the organization. Additionally, the Bylaws require the CFO disburse funds of the corporation as ordered by the Board of Directors.

ANALYSIS

In accordance with ICAF Bylaws, Article X, Section 7 (e) (1), the CFO of the organization is responsible for keeping and maintaining adequate and correct books and records; ICAF Bylaws, Article XII, Section 3, specifies the requirements pertaining to the organization's Annual Report. The annual report is prepared without audit from the corporation's books and records.

At the Board meeting, the CFO presents the annual report on the financial condition of the organization for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 with prior year comparison for FY 2021-22. Additionally, the CFO will present the annual report on the financial condition of the organization for FY 2023-24 with prior year comparison information for FY 2022-23.

In accordance with ICAF Bylaws, Article X, Section 7 (e) (2), the CFO shall deposit or cause to be deposited all money and other valuables and the CFO shall disburse the funds as may be ordered by the Board of Directors. In 2011, the Board approved a resolution giving the CFO the authority to disburse funds under \$5,000 prior to Board action. Disbursements are ratified by Board action at the next Board meeting.

At the Board meeting, the CFO presents details on contributions/deposits, as well as expenses/disbursements.

The Statement of Contributions and Expenses for FY 2022-23 as compared to FY 2021-22, has program contributions increase of \$12,529.55.
