Irvine Senior Services will be hosting a series of programs at Lakeview and Rancho senior centers and Trabuco Center throughout the month of September. - New grant received to develop new programs:
 - o Restaurant program to allow for meal delivery from menu, once a week
 - TOGO program allowing friendly visitor volunteers to pick up a meal and have lunch with a participant
- Food waste from reservation no-shows and cancellations is being managed.
- Participant donations have increased.
