Your Guide to Irvine's First District-Based Election

With the November General Municipal Election, the City of Irvine is conducting its first district-based election. Below is helpful information for Irvine voters about this important transition.

Why is Irvine transitioning to district-based elections?

In October 2023, the Irvine City Council approved a resolution to adopt the Irvine Districts Map for district elections following an extensive public feedback and engagement process.

In March 2024, nearly 60% of Irvine voters approved Measure D, a Charter Amendment which expands the City Council from five to seven members and establishes six City Council districts, while maintaining a Mayor at-large.

How can I locate my district?

Visit the City's voting district dashboard available at cityofirvine.org/yourdistrict to locate your district and discover key features and facilities within it.

How do I know which City Council seats are up for election?

Voters in every district will have the opportunity to elect a Mayor for a two-year term. Voters in District 1 will elect a Councilmember for a two-year term. Voters in Districts 2, 3, and 4 will elect a Councilmember for a four-year term.

If I live in Districts 5 or 6, when do I have an opportunity to elect a representative?

Voters in Districts 5 and 6 will vote for a Councilmember to represent their district in November 2026 for a four-year term. Until then, residents in these districts will continue to be represented by Councilmembers at-large.

How and where can I vote?

Ballots will be mailed to all registered Irvine voters beginning October 7. Ballots can be returned by mail, at a secure ballot drop box, or a Vote Center anywhere in Orange County.

Three Vote Centers will open in Irvine on October 26. Twelve additional Vote Centers will open in Irvine on November 2.
