PUBLIC COMMENTS - NON-AGENDIZED ITEMS

Any member of the public may address the Commission on items within the Commission's subject matter jurisdiction but which are not listed on this agenda; however, no action may be taken on matters that are not part of the posted agenda. If 20 or fewer requests to provide public comments are submitted, each speaker shall be limited to three minutes. If between 21 and 30 speakers submit public comments, each speaker shall be limited to

two minutes. If more than 30 speakers submit public comments, each speaker shall be limited to 90 seconds per item. The time limit per speaker shall be established based on the number of requests to speak submitted to the Recording Secretary before the first speaker is called. Requests to speak submitted after the first speaker is called shall receive 90 seconds. These time limits may be shortened or extended, or a cumulative limit on the time for all public speakers may be imposed, at the discretion of the Chair or by a majority vote of the Commission.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/REPORTS

Announcements, Committee Reports, and Commissioner Comments are for the purpose of presenting brief comments or reports, are subject to California Government Code Section 54954.2 of the Brown Act, and are limited to three minutes per speaker. In addition, the Chair shall receive any necessary additional time to deliver announcements of community events and opportunities.

ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS

Additions to the agenda are limited by California Government Code Section 54954.2 of the Brown Act and for those items that arise after the posting of the Agenda and must be acted upon prior to the next meeting.

COMMISSION BUSINESS

Public comments on Commission items will be heard at the time the matters are considered. If 10 or fewer requests to speak are submitted, each speaker shall be limited to three minutes per item. If between 11 and 15 speakers submit requests to speak, each speaker shall be limited to two minutes per item. If 16 or more requests to speak are submitted, each speaker shall be limited to 90 seconds per item. The time limit per speaker shall be established based on the number of requests to speak submitted to the Recording Secretary before the first speaker is called. Requests to speak submitted after the first speaker is called shall receive 90 seconds. These time limits may be shortened or extended, or a cumulative limit on the time for all public speakers may be imposed, at the discretion of the Chair or by a majority vote of the Commission.

1. DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

This award was presented to the following individuals:

- William Lewis for dedicated service since 2014 in support of technology programs for older adults, providing over 5,730 volunteer hours.
- Jaes Mies for dedicated service since 2024 in support of technology programs for older adults, providing over 570 volunteer hours.
- Robert Purdie for dedicated service since 2011 in support of the Elderly Nutrition Program, providing over 5,260 volunteer hours.

2. IRVINE ANIMAL CARE CENTER OVERVIEW

James Warren, Irvine Animal Care Center (IACC) Supervisor, and Catherine Lovella, IACC Volunteer Program Supervisor, provided an overview of IACC programs, events, and renovation updates.

Discussion included: reduced fees for older adults; operating hours and public need; training classes, obedience, and behavioral support; scholarships; handling of wildlife issues.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - NON-AGENDIZED ITEMS

Joshua Poon, resident and Irvine student, spoke on his intergenerational school project focusing on bridging older adult isolation and students, whereby students would visit with older adults at centers to interview, use Artificial Intelligence (AI) to summarize stories, and possibly generate picture books or other media to preserve family history and culture. Mr. Poon stated he would like to collaborate with Irvine's senior centers on this project.

- A Cultural Cooking Program featuring Chef Paul Huang is set for August 29 at Lakeview Senior Center. The program features a brief lecture on cooking techniques and food safety, followed by a step-by-step demonstration of three flavorful dishes.
- The 3rd Annual Fiesta Latina en Irvine will be held on September 14 at the Great Park from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Attendees will experience vibrant cultures through music, dance, food, art, and activities designed for all ages at this free, familyfriendly event. A flier was provided.
- The 9th Annual Comedy Unleashed fundraiser for the Irvine Animal Care Center will be on September 16 at the Irvine Improv. The free event will feature educational displays, live entertainment, crafts, specialty food trucks and artistic demonstrations.
