The City of Irvine seeks experienced and motivated individuals to coordinate and oversee aquatics programs, staffing, training, special events, and activities at the William Woollett Jr. Aquatic Center.

Your Impact:

- Plan, direct, assign and review the work of staff performing lifeguard and swim/safety instruction and aquatics facility operations. Select, train, and evaluate performance of staff.
- Conduct bi-weekly staff trainings including CPR/AED, lifeguarding and other emergency procedures.
- Coordinate CPR/AED and other health and safety trainings for all City staff and coaching personnel.
- Provide oversight of the aquatics facility and the Learn-To-Swim program.
- Oversee program registration and waitlists for Aquatics programs utilizing the CivicRec registration system. Complete and compile course records and evaluations.
- Communicate program objectives and facility services to the public.
- Act as customer service liaison to user groups, school district personnel, and City staff. Diffuse patron concerns, think independently, and problem solve with minimal supervision.
- Possess knowledge of pressure washers, starting blocks, general maintenance, and Colorado Timing equipment.
- Set up water polo/swimming equipment and prepare facility for special events, coordinate the on-site responsibilities of aquatics staff and supervise all aspects of various special events.
- Coordinate maintenance and repairs; provide supervisory staff with details regarding upcoming maintenance.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years or older.
- Two years of college level work in Recreation, Physical Education or related field and two years of experience as a Lifeguard and Water Safety Instructor.
- Current, valid certification in First Aid, CPR, Lifeguard and Water Safety Instructor must be maintained during employment.
- Ability to swim 300 yards, tread water for a minimum of five minutes, lift and/or move over 100 pounds and retrieve/lift heavy swimmers, see and hear patrons in life and or health and safety situations.

- Ability to work cooperatively with supervisors, staff, program participants, and facility group users.
- Strong conflict resolution, interpersonal, and communication skills.
