Construction Site

The following are methods of marking items commonly stolen from construction sites, including equipment, raw materials, doors, windows, electrical items, and appliances.

1. If equipment has a serial number, create a record listing item, brand/make, model, serial number, and store the information on-site.
2. Mark stacks of wood/construction materials in conformance with Irvine Police Department's marking standard, which is placing on one side of the stack the following information, painted with fluorescent paint, in numbers/letters at least 18 inches in height, which states: Irvine TT (for tentative tract) or PM (parcel map) followed by the tentative tract or parcel map number of the project. Place the following phone number, in numbers at least one-foot in height, underneath the tract or parcel map number, information: 949-724-7200.

3. Mark windows, doors, and circuit breaker boxes using a tag with the same information as listed above in No. 2. Affix the tag to the edge of windows, doors, and circuit breaker boxes. Tag should be a minimum one-inch by four-inches.
4. Mark appliances still in boxes with the same information as listed in No. 2 above, using fluorescent paint, with numbers and letters at least one-foot in height. If out of the box (stored or installed), apply a tag, as described in No. 3 above, to the back of the appliance.
